Conflict, natural disasters and persecution have forced more people than at any other time since records began to flee their homes and seek refuge and safety elsewhere. One in every 122 humans is now either a refugee, internally displaced, or seeking asylum. If this were the population of a country, it would be the world's 24th biggest.

The flight of refugees to Europe has also provoked the biggest-ever public, media and political debate on humanitarian issues in donor nations. What lessons can the humanitarian sector learn from the current crisis? How can we work with others outside the humanitarian sector to better protect and assist displaced people? And how might these inform debates on a new global deal for refugees towards the World Humanitarian Summit?
